Christmas Events:

Deco Day

The Christmas party for Foundation Stage/Key Stage 1 children will take place on Tuesday 12th December with the Key Stage 2 party on the following day, Wednesday 13th December. I'm sure the children are really looking forward to having some festive fun after working so hard throughout this term. As a reminder, the children do not wear school uniform on party days, but need to make sure that whatever they wear is suitable for the playground. Thank you to all the parents who have volunteered to help on the party days and to the PTA for their assistance with funding.

During the recent Anti-Bullying Week, teachers worked with their pupils to produce a 'class pledge' that described how our pupils can work together to look after their friends, keep bullying out of our school and not be a bystander if they see it happening. These pledges were mounted on decorated boxes and are displayed to make a 'Tower of Power' in the school entrance. They show that at St Clement's School we are committed to tackling bullying.

Maths Training

Earlier this term, class teachers received training on innovative ways to improve children's mathematical thinking and reasoning. This training was delivered by Helen Hackett, an experienced Maths leader from an outstanding school in Birmingham. Helen recently returned to school to work with teachers in classes and was amazed at the work going on with our pupils. The children are doing so well and are really beginning to understand the importance of being able to explain their thinking and look for more than one method when solving problems. In the New Year, Miss Hateley is keen to organise an open parent session to inform you of some of the changes we have made, particularly concerning the new mastery approach to teaching maths. Welfare Survey

Pupils from Year 2 to Year 6 completed a pupil welfare survey today which will provide me with information regarding how safe they feel at school, whether they enjoy their time on the playground and whether they have experienced bullying. I will share some of the key findings from this survey in the New Year. I am hoping that this data will support the recent findings at the Education Department that show that our school had the lowest incidence of bullying across the Island's primary schools.

Football

With no fixtures for the last two weeks, the girls have been showing off their skills recently at the first of their football tournaments. They thoroughly enjoyed their matches, some of which they won. Mr Mildren and Miss Hillsden reported that they had shown great determination, scored some great goals and had behaved superbly. A perfect afternoon – well done girls!

Children In Need

It seems like a long time ago now, but we raised a huge amount for Children in Need this year. The non-uniform day, cake sale and 'Cookie' Staff Bake Off were a huge success, although controversy over what constitutes a biscuit / cookie has been raging in the staff room ever since! Last year we completed a lot of work with the children about our core value of 'Empathy'. The children have really got a fantastic understanding of how important it is to think about and help others less fortunate than themselves. During the morning our Year 1 children were interviewed on local radio as they met Pudsey. When asked what they were doing and why, the first child that was interviewed, confidently explained that we had been thinking about other children and that we were raising money to help them. I was so proud of the responses that our children gave. Well done to everyone for raising over £900 this year.

I do hope that you all enjoy the next two weeks as we approach the special time that is Christmas – a time that can be so busy that we sometimes forget the most important things ... the remembering and retelling of a beautiful, old story ... the pleasure gained from both giving and receiving ... and the time shared with family.
