NEWSLETTER - FEBRUARY 2018

Can I begin by apologising for this long newsletter, but it is packed with plenty of important information, including dates, times and important safeguarding advice.

Difficult Times

Last week proved to be a difficult one for all staff, parents and pupils connected with St Clement's School. The conviction of Mr Le Masurier, along with subsequent media coverage, was a shock to us all. It raised the issue of how much information to share with the pupils themselves. Having taken advice from senior colleagues at the Education Department I decided to speak to the Year 5 and 6 children on Friday afternoon as many of them had received BSL lessons directly from Mr Le Masurier, although none of the children at St Clement's School had ever spent time alone, 1:1, with him. Some of the pupils had, out of curiosity, begun to ask questions amongst themselves and I wanted to reassure them that they were safe at school.

I am sure parents differ in their view regarding the extent to which the full details of the conviction should be discussed with their children. I have taken the line that the children needed to know that Mr Le Masurier had engaged in behaviour outside school that was completely inappropriate, and the consequence of the choices that he made makes it impossible for him to teach in our school, or any other school, again. I have made the decision that if parents want to discuss the matter in further detail, then they are free to do so. However, I am conscious that there are a large number of parents who I have spoken to that do not wish to do so, for fear of frightening their children. On Wednesday, I immediately spoke to the parents of our deaf children, some of which have been taught by Mr Le Masurier for a number of years. I have chosen not to speak to the children in the lower year groups as many of them will barely know Mr Le Masurier.

A number of parents came to see me towards the end of last week or contacted me via email to explain their concerns. If any other parents would like to arrange to meet me to discuss this issue please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

School Council Elections

Last week, the children took part in our annual School Council elections. Candidates from Year 1 to Year 6 were able to put themselves forward for nomination for one of the two posts available to their year group. Voting was organised to take place on Thursday morning with the results being shared in the assembly later on Thursday morning.

The first task for our School Council members will be to meet up after the Half Term holiday to consider their contribution towards the States of Jersey Children's Plan.

Year 3 Egyptian Assembly

Just a reminder to parents that our Year 3 'Egyptian' assembly is scheduled to take place this Thursday at 2.25pm. The children have really enjoyed studying this topic during the last few weeks. They loved their recent Egyptian banquet and are looking forward to sharing their learning with you during their assembly.

Online Safety Week

This week is Online Safety Week, incorporating Safer Internet Day, which is on Tuesday 6th February. The children will be discussing all sorts of online issues including personal details, in-app purchasing, photo-sharing and their digital footprint. To support this work I have arranged for our Community Police Officer to co-present an Online Safety meeting for parents after the half term break. In order to make the meetings as accessible as possible we have planned to have two meetings, one for Foundation Stage / Key Stage 1 parents at 3pm in the hall (the children will be asked to watch a video in the Year 2 classroom whilst the meeting goes on) and one for Key Stage 2 parents at 6.30pm.

We hope that this meeting will cover a range of issues including gaming and parental controls. I hope as many of you can attend as possible in order to increase awareness amongst our school community.

Tide Pod Challenge

The Education Department contacted me last week to warn of a safety issue that had been noted on You Tube / Facebook. The Tide Pod Challenge has become a recent problem in the US where young people have challenged themselves and their friends to post video footage of them biting down on small washing capsules sold by Tide. This obviously poses a large health and safety risk as the pods contain a variety of bleaches and detergents that should not be ingested. Whilst online examples have been noted in the US, searches for the term have begun to be picked up on monitoring software in Jersey. Can parents therefore be extra vigilant both with this type of product at home and also if they hear their children talking about this challenge.

PTA Disco

Tickets are still on sale for this week's PTA disco starring DJ Pretty. Just a reminder to parents that we have changed the timings of this year's event. The disco will begin at 5.30pm and finish at 7pm. Can parents please ensure that they pick up promptly at 7pm so that staff and PTA reps can go home on time too.

Collaboration Event

This half term's collaboration event is based around the use of ICT and is being split over a number of days. On Tuesday Key Stage 1 pupils will work together using ICT resources within school. On Thursday these pupils will then become the lead learners within the Foundation Stage to teach the younger children how to use these resources. On Wednesday, Key Stage 2 children will work in house groups to complete a variety of ICT based activities. Our Computing teacher, Mr Livesey, will also be involved in these creative activities which will allow the children to learn alongside each other.

Top Attendance!

I recently had a meeting with our school Education Welfare Officer, Christian Mullane, who was exceptionally pleased with our attendance figures from the last academic year. Our overall school figure was 97.4% attendance, which is above the Island and UK average of 96%. Punctuality had also improved, although this is still an area that I feel we can work on. I believe that school's play an important role in preparing children for their future employment. Being punctual is one small way that we can achieve this. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring that your children arrive at school at 8.40am, so that learning can begin promptly at 8.50am.
