#### **Welcome Back**

A Happy New Year to children, parents and friends of St Clement's School. We hope that everyone enjoyed the Christmas break. The children have returned to school looking very smart in their uniforms and look well rested and ready to learn.

The weather over the holidays has been quite cold and stormy. This seems set to continue during the first part of this term. Could you please ensure that your child has an outdoor coat with them every day so that they can enjoy break and lunch times, even if it is cold and windy. Please take extra care over the next few days as the stormy conditions are making travel difficult. The priority is for everyone to arrive safely, so please take your time if roads are closed or blocked.

During the first few days back at school we will be reminding the children about our Golden Rules and would appreciate your support in reinforcing these at home. Our Golden Rules are as follows:

- Be gentle, kind and helpful
- Work hard
- Be honest and truthful
- Listen to people
- Look after property

Classes will also be focussed on a Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship theme, 'Going for Goals'. This will involve children thinking, at an age appropriate level, about setting targets for themselves. This will work in conjunction with our discussions around New Year's resolutions. Teacher's will be encouraging our children to aim high and challenge themselves, particularly in the coming weeks. Pupils who have demonstrated this skill will be invited to my first Tea Party of the year on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> January where a special guest will be in attendance.

# **School Development Plan**

I am currently completing our School Development Plan for this calendar year, 2018. Amongst other planned improvements, the school will have three main priorities for the coming year:

# 1. To continue to develop the teaching and learning of Mathematics.

This will enable the school to build on the successful training received last year which has already had a positive impact on pupils, particularly with their reasoning and problem solving skills. There will also be an opportunity to share with parents the principles behind the 'mastery' approach that we are currently using to teach the children.

# 2. To construct and begin to implement a three year plan to improve learning opportunities in the school's outdoor environment.

Making improvements to the school's outdoor environment will extend the variety of learning activities on offer, develop important physical skills and improve the quality of existing learning opportunities. As this outdoor plan is constructed it is my intention to present these to the PTA so that we can begin the necessary fundraising. I believe having a specific project will help to focus and boost fundraising. It will also provide something tangible that parents can see being improved and developed over time, as well as the difference that it is making to the children.

# 3. To review the planning and monitoring of the Jersey Curriculum across year groups.

This review will focus on the planning of all aspects of the Jersey Curriculum across the Key Stages. It will also ensure that the necessary internal monitoring procedures are in place to make certain that the curriculum is being taught as planned.

Over the coming week the school will be migrating its email communication from Parentmail to a piece of software called InTouch. This new system works in conjunction with our new school management system and so should operate more efficiently. Please be patient over the coming days – there may even be a few paper copies of letters during this transition period!

# **Year 5/6 Production**

This term is a very busy one, culminating in the performances of our Year 5/6 production which this year is titled, 'Pirates of the Curry Bean'. Auditions were completed just before the Christmas holidays and, after a great deal of deliberation, Mrs Dodds and Mrs Walker have finally decided on the casting of parts. The children will soon begin practising on a Wednesday after school scene by scene for their BIG production. The afternoon dress rehearsal will take place at 1.15pm on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> March with the evening performances on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> March and Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> March beginning at 7.00pm. Further information about tickets will be sent out after half term.

#### **Attendance**

I recently had a review meeting with our Education Welfare Officer around attendance and punctuality. Our school attendance for the last academic year was excellent – an average of 97.5%. This was above the average for the Island as a whole (96.5%). In order to streamline procedures for requesting term time leave, forms will no longer be kept and distributed through the school office. Short appointments will need to be made with either Mr Heaven or Mrs Hickling in order to obtain a form. The creation of a new online school calendar last term means that ten minute appointments can easily be made through Mrs Dixon in the school office. During these meetings parents will be informed whether the leave will be authorised or unauthorised and the possible consequences of the latter. This should speed the process up and make it more efficient.
