Dear Parents,

The Spring Term certainly has got off to a fast start and as we enter February, and hurtle towards the Half Term break, I thought that it would be a good idea to update parents on a number of pieces of school news.

Parent Teacher Discussions

Discussions are due to take place this week (4th-8thFebruary) and next week (11th-15thFebruary). Each appointment will last for 20 minutes and will provide an opportunity for parents to see what progress has been made since September. Discussions will centre around reviewing the pupil targets for Reading, Writing, Maths and Key Personal Skills that were set in the Autumn Term. They will also include the setting of new targets for the rest of the Spring Term / beginning of the Summer Term.

Thank you for your patience in using our new online booking system for Parent Teacher meetings. Whilst there have been some small organisational issues, mainly based around the differences between Miss/Ms, on the whole I think that the system represents a step forwards.

All parents, with the exception of one or two, have now booked an appointment time. If you are unsure about your booking please contact the school office where an overall list is being kept.

A short Smart Survey will be sent out to parents during next week, to obtain feedback and ask for suggestions in order to improve the system further. This feedback is incredibly important as you are the end users and we may be able to set the system up slightly differently next time to avoid any frustrations that you may have had. As always the survey will be short and to the point in order to maximise responses.

KS2 Spring Disco

This Thursday evening, 7th February, is our KS2 disco from 5.30pm to 7.00pm with our resident DJ Pretty 'spinning requested tracks on her decks'. Tickets cost £4 and include a bottle of water and a snack. There will be a variety of other accessories on sale including glow sticks and tattoos. There will also be the opportunity to have a go at some face art so bring lots of small change! Any interested dancers in KS2 should bring their money in a named envelope to Mrs Lumsden before Wednesday.

If there are any KS2 parents that can help selling accessories on the evening please let Mrs Lumsden know.

Industrial Action

Thank you for your understanding around the recent day of industrial action. A combination of sound planning and your patience and understanding meant that the day ran smoothly, with pupils safely arriving and leaving school at the appropriate times. At this current moment I am not aware of any other planned action, but will keep parents updated if this situation changes.

Children's Plan Workshop

Last week Pedro Malta and a fellow Year 6 pupil represented St Clement's School at the above workshop. Children from all of the Island's schools listened to a brief summary of the 4 outcomes of the Children's Plan:

- Grow up safely - Learn and Achieve - Live Healthy Lives - Be Valued and Involved

The children then discussed one of the areas in depth in small focus groups with other children and politicians. Our School Council is beginning a piece of work around the 'Live Healthy Lives' section. We are working at improving our school in this area. This may involve discussions around healthy lunches, further lessons around healthy living, including mental health and wellbeing, and how we can adapt our school environment to encourage pupils to be more active. Well done to Pedro and his Year 6 partner who were excellent ambassadors for our school. They will now assist Mrs Lumsden in leading this initiative over the coming months.

Parent Consent Forms

Every child in the school will come home today with an updated Parent Consent Form. These forms are vitally important as they clearly set out what you, as parents, give permission for with regards to your child's and your personal information. We have had to update our consent so that it is GDPR compliant, but have also added a number of new items for parents to consider.

The first concerns the use of pictures of your child on school social media sites such as Facebook and Twitter. Whilst we do not currently have an official school Facebook page we are planning to create one and so need to ensure that we have the correct permissions in place before we do so.

The second concerns parental consent for children to go on offsite educational visits. The form now contains an 'umbrella' consent for standard trips to Jersey Library, Jersey Zoo or the Maritime Museum. These trips are part of our core business as a school and so only require this type of over-arching consent. Separate, specific consent will still be gained for any activities that involve a higher level of risk e.g. surfing or kayaking.

Please consider carefully each of the consent statements, (ensuring both sides are completed) tick the appropriate boxes and return to school as soon as possible.

Safer Internet Day

Safer Internet is on Tuesday this week. The theme for this year's day is based around 'giving and receiving consent' which fits in nicely with the parent forms above. Classes will take the opportunity to discuss with children the challenges of online safety in an age appropriate way.

Sign to Sing

This week the children will participate in the annual 'Sign to Sing' event. This is the seventh time we have taken part in this National event. The whole school have been learning this year's song, Take That's 'Greatest Day', which is proving quite a tricky one to sign. We will be performing the song in Thursday's whole school assembly, alongside other schools and organisations across the UK. Children and parents are welcome to make a donation on the day which will be forwarded to this worthwhile charity.

Perseverance Day

Following on from last term's successful Empathy Day and Collaborative Deco Day, this term we have decided to organise a day of activities focussing on Perseverance. This will take place on Friday 15th February, just before the Half Term break. A variety of activities have been arranged to test the children's ability to stick at tasks and see them through. Our special guest is Mr Parkinson, the Island's Maths Advisor who is coming down with some particularly challenging logic problems. I hope that the children enjoy the fun activities on our third 'Core Value' day of the academic year.

Police Notice

The States of Jersey Police have asked me to make parents aware of the following:

It has been brought to the attention of the States of Jersey Police that a number of violence related offences have recently been posted on an Instagram page labelled Jersey scraps 2. The incidents captured are of local school children being filmed fighting and in some cases assaulted. The incidents are being investigated however in the meantime there is an urgent need to disrupt any similar future behaviour and to ensure that parents and children are informed that the Police are aware of these posts. We will be seeking to identify both those involved and of course those who are choosing to host and circulate such films and will be requesting your assistance via our school liaison officers in order to do so.

Spring Cross Country

The Autumn Term cross country attracted over 700 children from schools across the Island which is absolutely amazing. The second event of the academic year is due to be organised on Wednesday 27th February and will take place at Les Quennevais Sports Fields. The format will remain the same, with races taking place in the afternoon, during school time. The afternoon will begin with the Year 5 girls' race at 1pm, followed by the Year 5 boys, Year 6 girls and Year 6 boys respectively. This is a fantastic mass participation event, where some children enter to win, some simply to try and beat their finishing position in October and others just for the sheer fun of the challenge.

Whatever the reason for entering, we wish all of our runners the very best of luck and hope that they will 'Aim High' and persevere to the finish line!
